Travel Check-List for a Child with a Tracheostomy Tube



Here is what you need to care for your child's trach when you are not at home. It is a good idea to always have these supplies ready in case you travel unexpectedly.

Equipment



Go bag

Pulse oximeter

Portable suction machine



Portable oxygen (if applicable)



Ventilator (if applicable)



Self-inflating bag

"Go-Bag"



Dressina supplies



Hand sanitizer



Sat probes



Gloves Suction catheters



Saline ampules



Humidification (i.e. HME, or saline neb set-up with saline ampules, or ventilator with in-line HME)



Medical information card (diagnosis, medications, allergies, physician phone numbers, etc)

Tracheostomy change



Spare obturator



Spare trach tubes with size smaller (when commercially available)



Water-soluble Lubricant



For cuffed tubes: 10mL syringe (for deflating/ inflating cuff)—Bivona tracheostomies-prefill syringe with sterile water



Pre-cut Trach ties



Scissors
